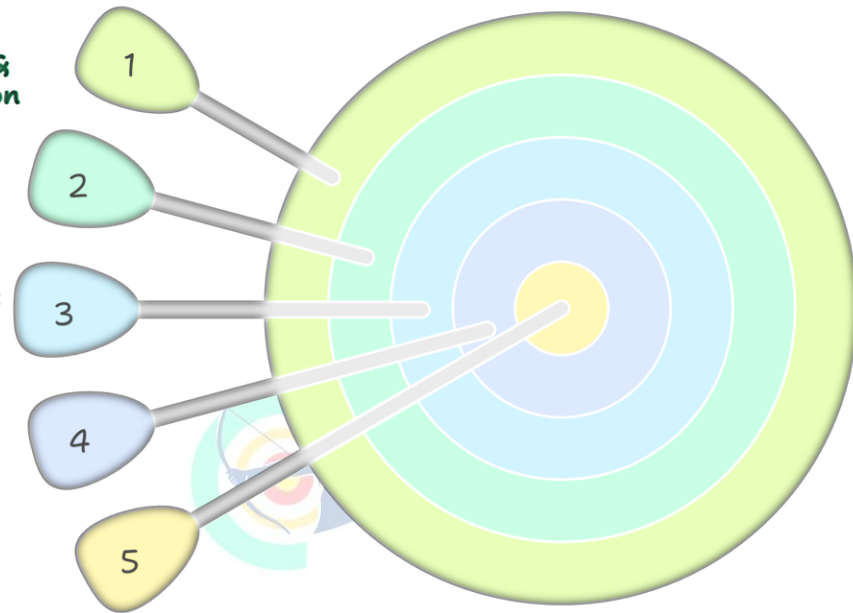

# Bihar Special Current Affairs

## (Last 1.5 Years: January 2024 - July 2025)

### I. Government & Administration

#### A. Policy & Schemes

1. Increased social security pension for elderly (above 60 years), widows, and disabled to ₹1,100/month (from ₹400), effective from April 2024, benefiting over 50 lakh people under the Mukhyamantri Vridhajan Pension Yojana as per Bihar Budget 2025-26.
2. Made computer education mandatory from classes 6 to 8 in government schools starting academic year 2024-25, with ₹500 crore allocated for digital infrastructure in 5,000 schools.
3. Approved formation of Special Tiger Protection Force (STPF) in July 2024, comprising 100 personnel with ₹20 crore initial funding for tiger conservation in Valmiki Tiger Reserve.
4. Formed three new state commissions: Scheduled Tribe (launched September 2024), General Category (October 2024), and Minority (November 2024) with combined ₹50 crore budget to address grievances and promote rights.
5. Announced computer training for prisoners in March 2025, targeting 10,000 inmates across 58 jails, in collaboration with NIIT, to enhance employability post-release.
6. Requested 90% central funding for schemes during NITI Aayog's 10th Governing Council meeting on July 27, 2024, focusing on flood management and agriculture.

7. Approved 200 'Tarkari Outlets' by Cooperation Department in January 2025, with ₹100 crore investment to provide affordable vegetables to urban consumers via cooperatives.
8. Introduced foreign language teaching (French, German) in 15 government engineering colleges under 'Saat Nischay One' from August 2024, benefiting 3,000 students annually.
9. Approved ₹4,415 crore project for flood mitigation in February 2025, including embankments and drainage in 10 flood-prone districts, expected to protect 20 lakh hectares of land
10. Extended 'Jal Jeevan Hariyali Abhiyan' to FY 2029-30 in March 2025, with additional ₹2,000 crore for water conservation, planting 5 crore saplings in 2025 alone.
11. Announced ₹50 lakh ex-gratia for families of martyrs in 'Operation Sindoor' (anti-Naxal ops) in April 2024, disbursed to 15 families so far.
12. Forming 'Jeevika Banks' from May 2024, empowering 1.2 crore women in SHGs with ₹5,000 crore credit linkage for micro-enterprises.
13. Declared annual state ceremony for Sushil Kumar Modi's death anniversary (April 22) starting 2025, with events in Patna honoring his contributions to Bihar's development.
14. Launched 'Mahila Samvad Abhiyan' by Rural Development Department in June 2024, reaching 2 crore women through 50,000 dialogues on empowerment and schemes.
15. Approved 649 bridges worth ₹2,977.12 crore under 'CM Gramin Setu Yojana' for FY 2025-26, construction starting July 2025, to connect 1,000 remote villages.
16. Marked 9 years of total liquor prohibition (April 5, 2016 implementation) in April 2025, with over 5 lakh arrests and ₹10,000 crore saved in social costs as per government claims.
17. Launched 'Mukhyamantri Nari Samvardhan Yojana' in July 2024, allocating ₹1,500 crore for skill training and loans to 10 lakh women.

18. Formed 'District Planning Area Authority' at all 38 district HQs in August 2024 for urban planning, with ₹200 crore for master plans.
19. Became first state to launch 'Bihar Mukhyamantri Gramin Awas Yojana' in September 2024, providing housing to 5 lakh rural poor with ₹1.2 lakh per unit.
20. Transferred ₹1,200 crore as first installment to 3 lakh families under PM Awas Yojana Gramin in October 2024, completing 1 lakh houses by March 2025.
21. Sanctioned ₹100 crore for 139 urban bodies under Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) in November 2024, installing 500 waste processing units.
22. Approved ₹62 crore for pulse crop promotion under Fourth Agriculture Road Map in December 2024, targeting 2 lakh hectares and 5 lakh farmers.
23. Launched 'Paryatak Home Stay Yojana' in January 2025, subsidizing 1,000 homestays with ₹50 crore to boost rural tourism revenue by 20%.
24. Launched 'Mera Prakhand Mera Gaurav' campaign by Tourism Department in February 2025, involving 8,000 blocks in pride-building activities.
25. Launched 'Selfie with Dustbin' by Patna Municipal Corporation in March 2025, garnering 1 million selfies and improving cleanliness rankings.
26. Planned 'Jeevika Haats' on lines of 'Dilli Haat' starting April 2025, with 50 markets for artisans, expected to generate ₹100 crore annually.
27. Announced 25% subsidy for Hindi films and 50% for regional films shot in Bihar in May 2025, attracting 20 productions worth ₹500 crore.
28. Decided to open 'Alpavas Griha' (short-stay homes) in 27 districts in June 2025, with ₹150 crore for sheltering 10,000 women/children yearly.
29. Planned organic vegetable/fruit cultivation in 20,000 schools as 'Poshan Vatika' from July 2024, benefiting 50 lakh students' nutrition.
30. Launched 'E-Shiksha Kosh App' for teacher attendance in August 2024, covering 2 lakh teachers and reducing absenteeism by 15%.

31. Passed Bihar Lok Pariksha Vidheyak 2024 in September 2024: 10-year jail and ₹1 crore fine for exam malpractices, applied in 5 cases so far.
32. Approved airport-like bus stand in Darbhanga (₹92 crore) in October 2024, completed by June 2025 with modern amenities for 50,000 daily passengers.
33. Approved Film Promotion Policy 2024 with ₹4 crore grants in November 2024, supporting 10 films and creating 5,000 jobs.
34. Announced ₹11,500 crore for irrigation and flood prevention in December 2024, irrigating 10 lakh hectares and reducing flood damage by 30%.
35. Launched 'e-Maapi' website for online land measurement in January 2025, processing 1 lakh applications digitally.
36. Announced reservoir on Avsan River in February 2025, ₹300 crore project to irrigate 50,000 acres in Rohtas district.
37. Launched 'E-Kshamta App' with Ashrita Foundation in March 2025 for free ANM study materials, aiding 20,000 nursing students.
38. Organized 'Ayushman Swasthya Shivar' monthly at 10,000 health centers from April 2025, screening 50 lakh people.
39. Provided ₹2 lakh aid to ~94 lakh poor families under 'Bihar Laghu Udyami Yojana 2024' in installments starting May 2024, creating 20 lakh self-employment opportunities.
40. Approved 'Amrapali Training Centers' in all 38 districts in June 2024, ₹50 crore for training 5,000 artists in folk arts.
41. Announced up to ₹20 lakh annual sports scholarship for state players in July 2024, awarded to 500 athletes in 2025.
42. Launched 'E-Shiksha Kosh Portal' in August 2024 for scheme benefits info, accessed by 1 crore users.
43. Announced Google mapping for Son River banks by Mines Department in September 2024 to curb illegal mining, identifying 200 violation sites.
